










The Perth to Pinnacles tour focuses on the 'spaces in between' including:

- Find out the stories behind small coastal towns like Guilderton, Seabird, Lancelin and Cervantes
- Make moments understand how the landscape changes over the seasons, find the best place to look for humpback whales, swim with bottlenose dolphins or spot a kangaroo
- Eat like a local the region is famous for its seafood, including the famed Western Rock Lobster.
- Immerse yourself see the regional differently with your own digital 'Welcome to the Pinnacles' Post Card, talking thrombolites, sailing ships and wildflowers all year round





Our background

How Stories Unseen started

Stories Unseen started as a response to how empty Perth's CBD felt post pandemic in February 2022 by co-founders Damien Fitzpatrick and Erin Clark. At the time they lived fulltime in Perth's CBD, spending their free time exploring the City's vibrant hospitality and arts scene, and were frustrated at the demise of many of their favourite restaurants and cafes. Having travelled extensively, Damien and Erin's favourite thing to do when they are travelling is to do walking tours. They wanted to get people back out and exploring but couldn't find a good alternative. So, they created one.

Initially focused on providing 'adults-only' experiences, their first tour was the Perth Pub Crawl, which has now evolved to Tales On Tap, reflecting that our charismatic virtual guides are now front-and-centre for each tour. By popular demand, Stories Unseen now provides a range of curated tours for all interests and ages.

The concept has now expanded to a number of cross-industry and location collaborations. This includes an exciting partnership with Sondra Stewart, Managing Director of *Adelaide Destination Management Co.* Sondra's deep knowledge of Adelaide's tourism landscape and her passion for sharing the city's unique heritage made her the perfect partner for this venture. Together, Erin Clark, Damien Fitzpatrick and Sondra Stewart developed the *Adelaide Firsts* tour, blending *Stories Unseen's* innovative approach with Adelaide's rich history. This collaboration reflects the shared vision of creating immersive, self-guided tours that engage both locals and visitors, highlighting the city's vibrant cultural and historical landmarks.

Today's focus

The tourism and hospitality sector today faces a different challenge – how to delight tourists amid rising costs and worker shortages. Popular tourism destinations are increasingly crowded, while lesser-known destinations struggling to attract high yield travellers.
